CPR BY CPA

Consistent, Predictable Routines (CPRs) by Consistent, Predictable Adults (CPAs) help develop a sense of safety, predictability, and security for young people.

All students rely on adults to create this level of safety and certainty. Teachers have spent much time during the first weeks of school establishing consistent predictable classroom routines.

Parents can support this from home by supporting school routines

<u>Before School</u>: wait in the right areas, no games, have a hat, and be on time for the start of the school day (8:35 a.m.).

After School: leaving through the right gates (students should not leave through the parish gate alone), students waiting at the Hall, no games.

Having good home routines before and after school also helps with developing a sense of predictability for a child.



CONSISTENT AND FIRM EXPECTATIONS

We all know that, at times, we can all be at risk of not being at our best. This is especially true of young people who need time to develop the skills to engage within the school environment.

Supporting students when they first show signs of behavioural dysregulation prevents more serious problems from occurring.

When students consistently meet firm but fair expectations, they develop respect for all, feel a sense of safety and predictability, and settle into focusing on their learning.

UNIFORMS

Our Uniform Policy and Guidelines very clearly explain what students should be wearing. Always consult with these for clarity. Some important reminders:

- 1. All shirts, except the formal blouse, are <u>worn tucked</u> in. Please support this at home.
- 2.All items of uniform, especially hats, need to be <u>labelled</u>. Items such as drink bottles, lunch items etc. are clearly labelled.
- 3. Earrings are ONLY a <u>plain sleeper</u> or <u>simple small stud</u> with gold, silver or simple stone colour. No other variations are acceptable
- 4. Boys hair needs to be <u>neatly kept</u>. Hair that flicks into the eyes or longer than the collar needs correcting.
- 5. Shoes are all BLACK, no other colours. (no white soles)

The table below outlines the specific uniform days for Years 1 to 6 (**noting Prep wear their uniform each day except on Tuesday if they have a Centenary shirt).

RELATIONSHIPS AND SUPPORT

PARENT SOCIAL MEDIA GROUPS

Parents need to exercise caution when it comes to association with unofficial school communication forums e.g. Messenger groups. At times, these could conflict with school messages.

It is also important that these groups do not become a public forum for grievances. These should be directed privately to the school or member of staff you need to seek clarification.

These groups are best utilised for general reminders e.g. free dress days, excursions etc.

GRIEVENCES

When addressing a grievance, the integrity and respect of all individuals must be upheld.

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

There is a difference between Family Involvement and Family Engagement.

- Family Involvement builds social capital volunteering, working in the tuckshop, P&F, carnivals etc. This is very important but may not have a direct impact on student learning.
- Family Engagement sees parents understand their role as their child's first educator and work in partnership with the school to support their child to grow academically, spiritually, physically, and culturally. Engagement sees parents connected to learning. The family-school partnership is based on mutual responsibility, respect and trust. There is a shared understanding that families and the school want the best for their children. Family engagement is also connected with various indicators such as more regular school attendance, better social skills, improved behaviour, and a stronger belief in the importance of education.
